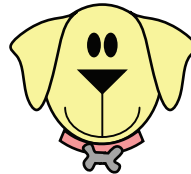

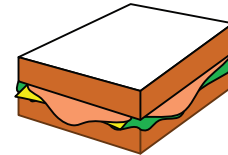

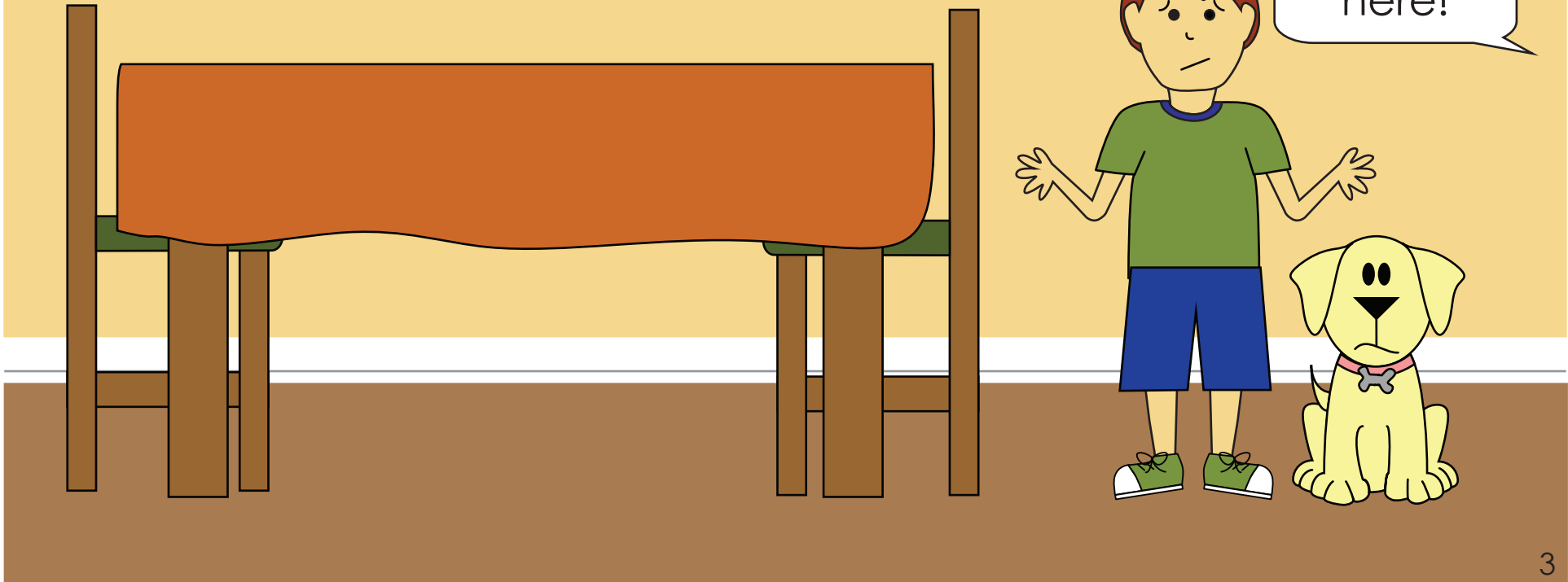
Story Starter

Yes, I want a drink.

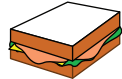


Jazz hopped in bed with Mom. Sam got Mom a glass of water for her to drink.

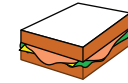
Mom, here is the drink. I am happy

Look, see the soup? Are you

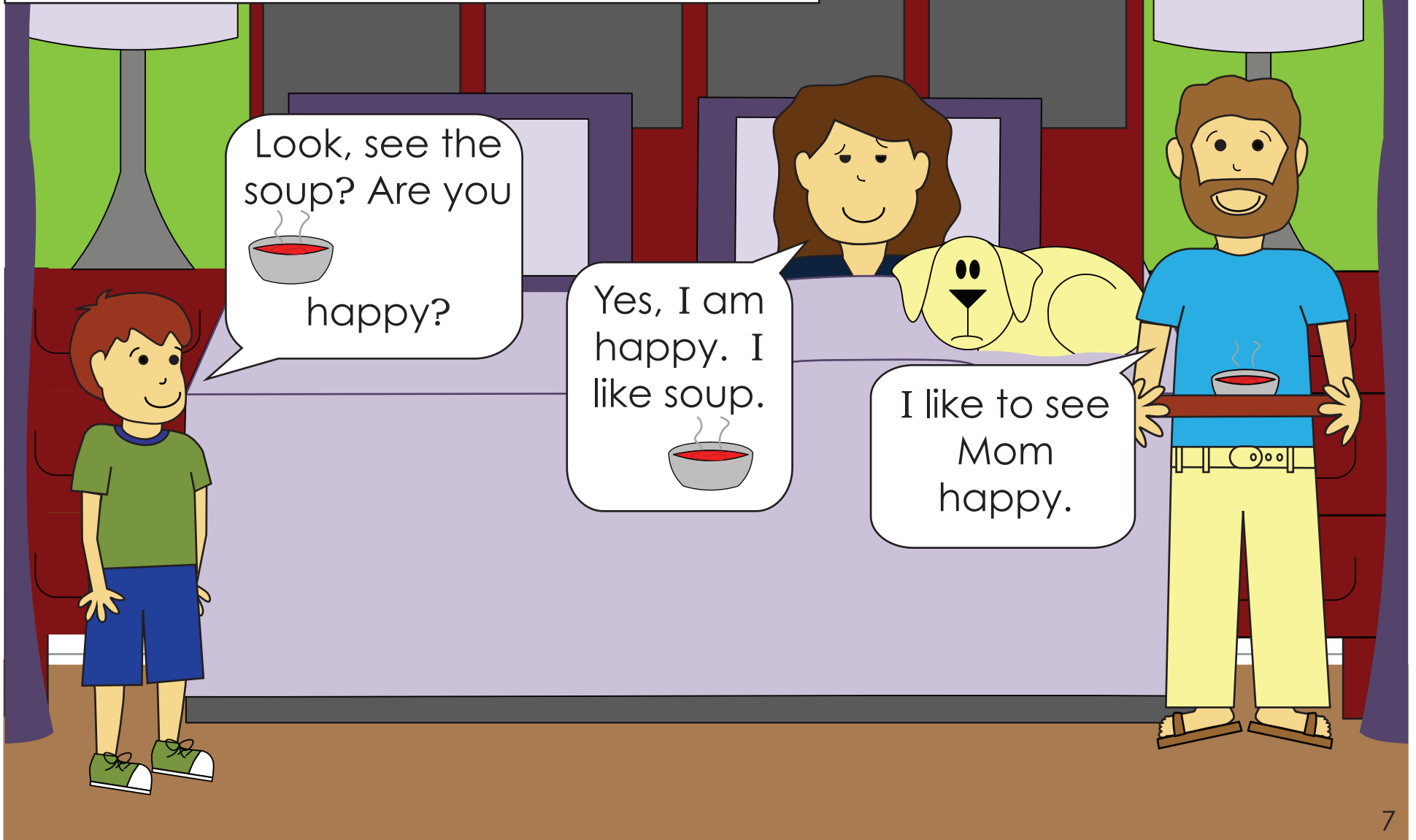


happy?
